Give Your Senator a Piece of Your Mind!

Calls to your Senator should be made on your personal cell phone or home phone. Calls can be made at the worksite if you are off duty and not in a public work area.

Two weeks ago, hundreds of AFGE activists hand delivered thousands of petitions to their Senators' Washington office demanding an end to the attacks on federal employees. Now you can help keep the momentum going and reinforce our message by phoning your Senators today

It's easy. Use your personal cell phone. You can make your call at the worksite as long as you are not on duty time.

- Dial 202-224-3121. Ask the Capitol Hill Switchboard operator to connect you with your Senator's office.
- When the Senator's receptionist answers the phone, you can leave a message like ty8sin the Senator's office answers this:

"My name is (give your first and last name). I'm a (give the name of your state) voter and member of AFGE. I urge the Senator to oppose efforts to slash federal programs, wages, jobs, and benefits, and to support a real economic recovery plan that creates good jobs and puts middle-class America back on track."

When you're done calling your first Senator, please call the second one.

Making your call only takes a few minutes. But it's a critical step to letting your representatives know you're serious about stopping the race to the bottom. Don't wait – pick up the phone now!

And thanks. Collectively, we can make sure Senators' phones are ringing off the hook with calls to stop hurting the middle class workers who can least afford it.
